PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am honoured to be writing this President's Report in this the 100th anniversary season of this great Club. Firstly, let me thank everyone who is and has been part of the Normanhurst Cricket Club Community; players, captains, coaches, managers, supporters, family members, whoever you are. The Club is only as successful as the people inside and around it. This is a great Club to be part of and you all contribute to the Club's culture and success.

In recognition of the 100th anniversary season, the Club produced a new logo and merchandise, including a new playing and training strip. Centenary coins were produced and used at the toss for every game. We launched the season with our "RedBlacks Day". A truly fantastic Club and Community event. Over 100 junior players were out on the oval in the morning, engaged in various cricket related activities, from fastest ball, longest throw and catching competitions. Then in the afternoon the seniors played an exciting 100 ball match, as Deep Third Man was turned into an on field bar. What a start to the season!

We finished the season with our 100 year anniversary dinner and with guest speaker Simon Katich. We welcomed back past players to celebrate with current players in what was a very special night, reminiscing about past glories on the field and looking to make new stories in the future.

Looking at the present, the Club should be incredibly proud in the recent growth of junior cricket and girls cricket. The last 5 years have seen our junior player numbers increase from a low of 78 to almost double with 132 registered players. We now have 15 junior teams which includes a shared girl's team with Kissing Point. In addition, of particular note is our under 15 mixed team evenly comprised of 6 girls and 6 boys. The first challenge in the next chapter of the Club's life is to increase girls' participation in cricket.

I welcome returning players and families but especially want to welcome new players and families to the club, especially if it is your first season playing cricket.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of our 2025-26 Committee, including Chris Fitzpatrick (Vice-President), Justin Gross (Treasurer), Harry Hegarty and Rob Jones (Seniors Co-ordinators), Ryan Cherrie (Juniors Coordinator), Will McCarroll (Blast Coordinator), Craig Woods, Peter Bradey, Andrew Watson, Mark Farag.

CLUB TROPHIES & AWARDS

NCC presents the following awards and trophies:

- Each new junior player starting his or her junior cricket with NWCC is presented with a personalised plaque. Each season after that, a new team plate is presented to be added to their plaque (there's room for 10 plates).
- Each junior team Coach / Manager or senior team Captain awards 3 individual trophies to recognise special achievements (2 individual trophies are awarded for the Under 8, Under 9, Under 10 and Under 11 teams due to the reduced number of players in these sides).
- Each team Coach / Manager also nominate players for the club's perpetual trophies, from which the winners are selected by the NCC Committee.
- Any player in competitive cricket who scores a century is presented with a minibat outlining the details (name, score, grade, opposition & date). Their name and score are added to the NCC Bill Kemsley Batsmens' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who achieves a hat-trick during the season is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those achieved in competitive cricket their name and figures are added to the NCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 5 or more wickets in an innings is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their name and figures are added to the Somaiya Acheson NCC Bowlers' Honour Board
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 7 or more wickets in an innings or 10 or more wickets in a match, is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their name and figures are added to the NCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player who has played for NCC in 100 competitive games (excluding Kimbo Cup and John Hayne Cup) is presented with a NCC red & black baggy cap embroidered with "100" and their initials.
- Players, coaches and managers in teams that win their competition are presented with a NCC Premiership plaque. HK&HDCA presents the players with a NCC embroidered red & black baggy cap.
- Each team Coach and Manager is recognised for their efforts throughout the season.

SENIOR CRICKET CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

The 2025/26 seniors season represented a special one, being the centenary season. As one of the founding clubs for the association, Normanhurst C.C was once again returning to the seniors arena. Fielding three sides in A grade, B2's and C2's and entering the Cricket NSW Community Cup for a third consecutive season. All teams were competitive and played with passion and true cricket spirit.

Before a ball had even been bowled, the season started with a centenary '100' match. Mate vs mate looking to gain bragging rights. It was team Vicway vs team Normo, with team Vicway captained by Jordan Hayes, taking the chocolates.

A Grade

After a long-awaited return to A-grade the season previous, the boys returned to where it all started a century ago, looking to replicate a similar result all those years ago. Following on from a year where a young squad learnt a few lessons in what was a real 'Welcome to A Grade' season, the boys looked to take those lessons and put them into practise. The young squad faced a tough challenge first up, facing Berowra, who had lost their first final in years. But the boys had a serious crack and had the former premiers sweating, however, the experience of the former champions was too much for the boys. The boys then went winless through the next 4 rounds and were looking down the barrel of another wooden spoon. But that all was about to change, spurred on by what can only be defined as one of the more telling rain delays, the boys gathered around in the Parklands change room and bonded. A bond that would rally and bring the boys together, and which resulted in their first win for the season, the week after against Hornsby, winning in the final over.

This sparked a good run of form with wins in the Community Cup and a tight win against Kissing Point. But the biggest upset was yet to come with the boys getting the win against last year's champions, West Pennant Hills, on a tricky Kenthurst wicket. 2 washed out, including one against Hornsby, in which the boys were well ahead of the game before the heavens opened up. The boys gave Berowra a serious challenge but ultimately were outplayed by the eventual champions.

With finals requiring a big win in Round 13 against St Ives, up steps Will McCarroll. McCarroll's incredible 169 off 150 balls shattered the St Ives bowling attack and put Normo in the box seat. St Ives in reply were gritty, batting their way through the second and salvaging a draw, ultimately ending A-grades finals chances.

A few mentions should go to the following: Will McCaroll who finished as the third leading batter in the comp with 411 runs with an average of 34.25 with 3 50's and 1 100. Will also cleaned up in the awards, taking out top batter, and fielder for the club. Elliot Kerr, who led Normo's bowling this year and finished 9th in the comp with 21 wickets at an average of 22.95. Aaron Kerr, who had 366 runs and 13 wickets.

The boys should keep their heads held high. As a team, they improved as the season went on, with a lot of positives to take into next season. Will the turn of the century lead to a Normo dynasty? We will have to see...

B2S

The B2s boys came into the season hungry for success after the previous season ended winless. The squad was injected with some new blood and mixed with experience and multiple club legends, the season looked bright. But the first win continued to elude the group, going winless in their first 4 games whilst staying competitive and in the contest throughout.

However, the drought would be broken with a tight victory against Hornsby, spurred by strong performances by Will Waters, Ash Tonnet and Wayne Slawski. This victory would kick-start the boys' season, and after the Christmas break, the boys were the team to beat, going undefeated, including 2 wash-outs. And standout performances weren't hard to find. President Paul Bickerstaff rewound the clock with a classy 118 against Sydney Lions, Sahil Kumar taking part in the destruction of Hornsby's top order, taking 5/7.

This strong finish to the season meant they were the only Normo side to make finals. They would face Hornsby in the semis. Winning the toss and sending Hornsby into bat, the boys rallied, taking early wickets before getting into the arm wrestle. But, consistent wickets throughout the innings restricted Hornsby to 9-104d. In reply, Normo faced an uphill battle, losing 5 early wickets. Woodsy and Charles attempted to settle things down, but Charles would soon depart. Normo would end up being all out for 70. But the boys came out to bowl with the hope of a second innings win. In true Normo spirit, they put serious pressure on the Hornsby side, so much so that two of their batters would be timed out. Requiring 196 in 20 overs, Normo gave it their very best right till the end, ultimately coming up 34 runs short of what would've been a win for the ages.

So many positives to take from the season, with new players finding their fronts and old players showing they still have what it takes. Hopefully, next season the group will go one better in the hunt for silverware.

C2S

C2s this season brought a level of excitement and intrigue as the team welcomed past players as well as players returning to the game. Nicknamed the “Dad’s Army”, the team was welcoming a host of players returning to the game after years out of the game. The ‘Army’ found their straps early, winning 3 out of their first 5 games, including a draw. Unfortunately, a couple of narrow defeats in the back half of the season saw any chance of the C2’s making the finals disappear. However, this did not diminish from the enjoyment that the team took from playing, and special acknowledgement must go to the vast number of players who donned the whites for the mighty ‘Army’ throughout the season. This includes the numerous juniors who made their senior debuts this year, such as Louie McCarroll and Tyler Ware, who were joint winners of the Rob Aldersley Memorial Trophy.

Not making the finals also did not detract from some wonderful individual performances during the season. Tom Barnes with a hat trick against Kissing Point and 5 wicket haul against Sydney Lions. Andrew ‘Watto’ Watson with an amazing 8-64 against Kenthurst, the eventual competition winners. Ian D’souza was one of the standouts with the bat, which included 118 against Beecroft. Skipper Simon Lawry was also a standout with the bat and ball, finishing the season with 438 runs with 5 fifties and a 5-wicket haul.

Community cup

For the third consecutive year, Normanhurst entered the Cricket NSW Community Cup. A statewide comp designed to put the best club teams against each other to reach finals day at Cricket Central. The boys were hungry for T20 success after losing in the Quarter finals the season prior, and were starved for T20 cricket by the association.

In round 1, the boys hosted Pitt Town at Mt Kuring-gai Oval. Skipper Jordan Hayes lost the toss, and we were sent into bat. The openers, Josh Hegarty and the skipper, set the tone, looking to dispatch the ball before both were dismissed. Despite this, Will McCarroll (34 off 19) and Aaron Kerr (57 off 34) steadied the ship, allowing the rest of the order to explode late in the innings. The team finished with a strong total of 8-174 with Aaron Kerr top scoring. In reply, Pitt Town got the boys nervous off the rip, speeding their way to 42 before Aaron took the crucial wicket of their opening batter. Wickets then fell at regular intervals, stopping any momentum that Pitt Town had. Small partnerships kept Pitt Town in the game, but when the game was in the balance, Normo would come out on top. Wickets, tight bowling and near-perfect fielding rolled Pitt Town for 154. Wickets from Luke Sylvester (1-40 plus 2 catches), Sahil Kumar (2-16), Keagan Hanekom (1-8 plus a run out) and fielding Efforts from Jordy, Elliot Kerr and Harrison Hegarty. The highlight and Man of the Match was, no doubt, Aaron Kerr, who finished with a match high 57 runs and figures of 3-38.

We then drew Dubbo in the second round, and to say the least, they were either too scared to make the trip down or just not bothered. Either way, a forfeit saw us return to the quarter finals, a game in which we would be facing fellow A-grade team, Kenthurst, who had beaten us weeks before. Jordy won the toss and sent Kenthurst in to bat. And a great toss to win it was. The Normo bowling unit showed the true carnage they can cause when all fit and firing. The boss took early wickets, and Kenthurst never recovered, being rolled for a below-par score of 76. Wickets were shared around with Luke (1-8), Jordy (1-21), Elliot (1-23), Liam Bradey (1-8), Josh (1-6), but the pick of the bowlers was yet again Aaron Kerr, who starred with 3-10. Veteran Craig Woods, with a classy run out finished the innings. In reply, the boys made light work of the small total with Jordy (34* off 38) and Will (30* off 26) guiding the boys home and getting them into finals day.

Lots of excitement and optimism filled the group as the big day came, but the weather gods weren't kind. Opponents, Lindfield stood in front of the boys' chances of a Grand Final appearance. Word started to spread about a probable bowl-off to determine a winner due to the weather. But the sky began to open and expose the type of weather that cricketers dream of. The covers were peeled off, and the game was limited to 6 overs per side. Normanhurst was sent into bat, and with such limited overs, a fast start was needed. But, against an experienced and quality attack, it was gonna be a challenge. Normo managed to make 4-43 off their 6, with Will top scoring with 18*. With a tough total to defend, the boys still believed. Wickets from Luke (1-9) and Jordy (2-10) kept us in it until the last over. But the boys would end the game in defeat, outplayed by a player a class above. It was a cruel way to lose, but the boys kept their heads held high. They played right until the last ball, and who knows what would've happened if we had more overs to play? An extremely positive T20 campaign that shows that this young group has what it takes to mix it with some of the state's best and will return next year, hopefully go one better. The T20 Player of the Year was Aaron Kerr.

Finally, I want to thank a few people, as without their help, this year wouldn't have been possible. Firstly, outgoing club president Paul Bickerstaff. Paul's commitment to Normanhurst Cricket cannot be judged. His ongoing support to all senior players set the foundations for a positive club culture on and off the field. Paul's leadership, hard work and dedication have set the club up to succeed well into the future.

Secondly, I want to thank Normanhurst life-member Craig Woods. 'Woodsy' was the senior coordinator until this season, stepping down from the role. Rob Jones and I were tasked with filling some big shoes. Woodsy set the foundations for how we looked to guide the seniors group through the season, and with Woodsy's guidance and reassurance, we continued his great work.

Lastly, I want to thank all the players who played with us this year. Without you, none of this would be possible. Clubs are built on the players, and your commitment this year can't be faulted. All players gave hundred 100% no matter what grade they played and continued to contribute to an ever-evolving club culture on and off the field. We will be back with a point to prove as we turn a new chapter and move into the next century.
