Better than that, she managed to field two teams in the U13 comp, more than any other club! With some great funding from grants being applied to the girls team kits, gear and training the club can very proudly say girls cricket has returned to Normo.

We have worked very closely with our neighbours at Thornleigh Cricket Club this year and managed to field a joint team in each of the U12 and U13 competition. Without that close work between our clubs there would have been a lot of players sitting out or not being able to play the game with friends. There are many more opportunities to partner with clubs like Thornleigh, providing access to cricket for our juniors and seniors that they would not otherwise have had. Thank you to our counterparts at Thornleigh, Carolyn Ball and Lachlan Reynolds, and in particular to our **Craig Woods**.

And this year the club also appointed its first Grants Coordinator, **Carolyn Ekins**. With the significant amounts of public/government funding available as a result of a number of restructures in recent years, the club felt that there was opportunity to start tapping into the monies and reinvesting in the club, its players and club infrastructure. Carolyn achieved so much for the club this year – not only was she able to access monies to allow our girls' teams to take the field, but also we have secured funding for our long overdue nets upgrade. Thank you to Carolyn (who is already working with us on the next projects), and thank you to **Mr Matt Kean** for your valued support of our club.

I thank all the parents, coaches, managers and other volunteers for the hard work and time you've all put into the club this season – none of this is possible without you. This reflects the great strength and morals of our great community and that, together with continued development and investment into the players and infrastructure of our club, ensures the club has a long bright future.

## CLUB TROPHIES & AWARDS

NWCC presents the following awards and trophies:

- Each new junior player starting his or her junior cricket with NWCC is presented with a personalised plaque. Each season after that, a new team plate is presented to be added to their plaque (there's room for 10 plates).
- Each junior team Coach / Manager or senior team Captain awards 3 individual trophies to recognise special achievements (2 individual trophies are awarded for the Under 8, Under 9 and Under 10 teams due to the reduced number of players in these sides).
- Each team Coach / Manager also nominate players for the club's perpetual trophies, from which the winners are selected by the NWCC Committee.
- Any player in competitive cricket who scores a century is presented with a minibat outlining the details (name, score, grade, opposition & date). Their name and score are added to the NWCC Bill Kemsley Batsmens' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who achieves a hat-trick during the season is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those achieved in competitive cricket their name and figures are added to the NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 5 or more wickets in an innings is presented with a trophy containing the match ball.
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 7 or more wickets in an innings or 10 or more wickets in a match, is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their name and figures are added to the NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any players who play continuously from Kanga/Have a Go/in2CRICKET to U/16s with NWCC will be presented with an award to recognise their long service and commitment to NWCC junior cricket.
- Any junior player who has played for NWCC in 50 competitive games (excluding Kimbo Cup) is presented with a NWCC "50 games" club cap.
- Any player who has played for NWCC in 100 competitive games (excluding Kimbo Cup and John Hayne Cup) is presented with a NWCC red & black baggy cap embroidered with "100" and their initials.
- Players, coaches and managers in teams that win their competition are presented with a NWCC Premiership plaque. HK&HDCA presents the players with a NWCC embroidered red & black baggy cap.
- Each team Coach and Manager is awarded a NWCC pilsner glass for their efforts throughout the season.

## JUNIOR CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

The 2018-19 juniors cricket season at Normanhurst-Warrawee Cricket Club was one of increased diversity. For the first time in many years, the club had all-girls cricket on offer. The interest was so high, the club was able to field two all-girls teams. Another point of diversity was the formation of two combined-club junior cricket teams. Normanhurst-Warrawee and Thornleigh cricket clubs joined forces so that the numbers stacked up to field an U12 team and an U13 team. This collaborative approach was enriching for the clubs and also for the players involved.

Pre-season, as registrations came in, it was apparent that we had strong interest from young cricketers. Consequently, we were able to form two U9 teams, most of whom were new to club cricket. Both the red and the black U9s had much fun developing their skills and playing their Saturday matches.

The U10 team had a strong season. While there are no competition ladders in the U10 competition, the players were thrilled to win many games, with a 70% success across all matches played.

The U11 team had their first experience competing across a season. The players managed to win a few matches, but more importantly, they enjoyed the team spirit while developing their cricket skills further. Similarly, the U12 team won a few matches and the players very much enjoyed being part of a cross-club team with Thornleigh Cricket Club. The other cross-club junior team was the U13 team, who also joined forces with Thornleigh players, enjoying what proved to be a challenging season.

The most senior Normanhurst-Warrawee junior team for 2018/19 was the U14 team. They had a mixed season, finishing midway on the competition ladder.
