CLUB TROPHIES & AWARDS

NWCC presents the following awards and trophies:

- Each new junior player starting his or her junior cricket with NWCC is presented with a personalised plaque. Each season after that, a new team plate is presented to be added to their plaque (there's room for 10 plates).
- Each junior team Coach / Manager or senior team Captain awards 3 individual trophies to recognise special achievements (2 individual trophies are awarded for the Under 9, Under 10 and Under 11 teams due to the reduced number of players in these sides).
- Each team Coach / Manager also nominate players for the club's perpetual trophies, from which the winners are selected by the NWCC Committee.
- Any player in competitive cricket who scores a century is presented with a minibat outlining the details (name, score, grade, opposition & date). Their name and score are added to the NWCC Bill Kemsley Batsmens' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who achieves a hat-trick during the season is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those achieved in competitive cricket their name and figures are added to the NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 5 or more wickets in an innings is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their name and figures are added to the Somaiya Acheson NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 7 or more wickets in an innings or 10 or more wickets in a match, is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their name and figures are added to the NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player who has played for NWCC in 100 competitive games (excluding Kimbo Cup and John Hayne Cup) is presented with a NWCC red & black baggy cap embroidered with "100" and their initials.
- Players, coaches and managers in teams that win their competition are presented with a NWCC Premiership plaque. HK&HDCA presents the players with a NWCC embroidered red & black baggy cap.
- Each team Coach and Manager is recognised for their efforts throughout the season.

JUNIOR CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

SENIOR CRICKET CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

The 2021-2022 season was once again affected by Covid, with the Preseason T20 comp not played and all regular season matches played as one day games.

NWCC entered 3 teams to the senior competition, we originally fielded a team in the Kookaburra Competition before that team was re rated back to B Grade competition. The other teams competed in the C1 and C4 competitions.

The club saw the highest numbers of new players for many seasons, with a number of family combinations highlighting the spirit the club enjoyed throughout year.

The club saw plenty of success throughout the year with all three teams making the Semi Finals and the C Grade team being crowned PREMIERS.

B Grade team had a the most changes to personnel from the previous season with only 4 of the previous highest graded team returning. Captained by Tejas Padsala through the first half of season before he moved to South Australia when Tim Acheson took over the captain's role for remainder of season.

The team played the first 6 rounds in the Kookaburra cup competition before moving to B Grade where they won 5 matches, lost 3 and had 2 draws, finishing the regular season 3 rd on the table. Unfortunately, there wasn't a ball bowled either week of the semi-final due to rain ending the season just as the team were finishing strong.

C Grade team saw the return of a few old combinations, the bowled SOMAIYA caught WOODS made a return. The team consisted of the older wiser generation and the younger (capable of running around the outfield for old blokes) generation.

Regular season saw the team win 8, draw 3 and lose 5 games to finish 2 nd on the table. The Semi-final against St Ives didn't see any play due to rain which sent the team straight to the Grand Final. The Grand final was rain affected but the Team bravely held on to draw the match for a Normanhurst Win. During the final up against a higher rated team and with Normo in trouble a couple of young guns Harry Hegarty (127 balls) and Ash Tonnet (112 balls) shared a partnership to steady the team and ensure Normo took the premiership. The WIN was celebrated in fine style by team and many of the Normo supporters and players from other teams.

C3 Grade team had a changing of the guard with Andrew WATTO Watson Captaining the team with plenty of enthusiasm and energy. The team was mostly made of up of younger players and those that were making a comeback to playing cricket after some time away from the game.

The team finished the regular season with 6 wins, 3 draws and 7 losses to finish 4 th on the table The semi-final saw the team take on the first placed Beecroft in a rain affected match. Nil play was possible on day 1, Normo battered first on day 2 declaring at 8/119 after 36 overs, they then had Beecroft under enormous pressure but unfortunately there wasn't enough time in the day and Beecroft finished at 7/69 off 39 putting them into the Grand Final and bringing Normo's season to an end.

The club enjoyed an influx of new players and returning players, a number of family combinations during the season was especially pleasing to see with father and son combinations, Craig and Ben Woods, Wayne and Oliver Slawski, Chris and Matthew Fitzpatrick and Stephen and Thomas Fearnside all getting to play matches together. The club also saw three brother combinations being the Kerrs' Hegarty's and Di Veroli's playing together.

During the season the club saw some tremendous individual efforts across all three grades, Aaron Kerr 18 wickets (reg season) at 7.61 average, Naish Somaiya 20 wickets (including GF) at 9.50. Max Di Veroli, Reon Rebello Elliot Kerr and Andrew Watson all took 15 wickets. Time Acheson Taking 6-16 for B Grade in Round 10 and Henry Gross taking 5-18 for C4 in round 6.

The Fearnside father and son combination Stephen 376 runs @ 37.60 (3 half centuries) Thomas 215 runs @30.71 (2 half centuries) claimed the batting honours this year.

Once again, the end of season Presentation Day was held at Pennant Hills Bowling Club with a game of lawn bowls followed by the presentations.
