CLUB TROPHIES & AWARDS

NWCC presents the following awards and trophies:

- Each new junior player starting his or her junior cricket with NWCC is presented with a personalised plaque. Each season after that, a new team plate is presented to be added to their plaque (there's room for 10 plates).
- Each junior team Coach / Manager or senior team Captain awards 3 individual trophies to recognise special achievements (2 individual trophies are awarded for the Under 9, Under 10 and Under 11 teams due to the reduced number of players in these sides).
- Each team Coach / Manager also nominate players for the club's perpetual trophies, from which the winners are selected by the NWCC Committee.
- Any player in competitive cricket who scores a century is presented with a minibat outlining the details (name, score, grade, opposition & date). Their name and score are added to the NWCC Bill Kemsley Batsmens' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who achieves a hat-trick during the season is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those achieved in competitive cricket their name and figures are added to the NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 5 or more wickets in an innings is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their name and figures are added to the Somaiya Acheson NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board
- Any player in competitive cricket who takes 7 or more wickets in an innings or 10 or more wickets in a match, is presented with a trophy containing the match ball, and for those performances achieved in competitive cricket, their name and figures are added to the NWCC Bowlers' Honour Board.
- Any player who has played for NWCC in 100 competitive games (excluding Kimbo Cup and John Hayne Cup) is presented with a NWCC red & black baggy cap embroidered with "100" and their initials.
- Players, coaches and managers in teams that win their competition are presented with a NWCC Premiership plaque. HK&HDCA presents the players with a NWCC embroidered red & black baggy cap.
- Each team Coach and Manager is recognised for their efforts throughout the season.

JUNIOR CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

Firstly, I want to say a big thank you to Justin and Woodsy. They both do a tremendous job in running the club. It is pleasing to see the club growing and achieving so much under their leadership. I also want to say a big thank you to the Coaches and Managers who provide a great environment for our teams to play in.

The club had another increase in junior teams this year, from 6.5 to 9.5 teams. The .5 being a combined under 14s team with Thornleigh.

HKDCA introduced an under 8/9 Master Blasters Saturday morning competition this season and we had 3 teams enter that age group, which saw 25 young kids play their first Saturday morning cricket. This is a great number!

Throughout the other age groups, the club had two under 10s team, an under 11s, two under 12s teams and an under 13 and under 14 team.

The club also had 1 very successful girls team, which again won their Saturday afternoon competition.

I'd also like to mention to the two under 12s teams. Under 12s being the first year of competitive cricket. The Under 12s Black team finished second on the table and were unlucky not to get a chance to play the Grand Final which was rained out. The under 12 Reds finished the season strongly to finish 7th. The Reds were a young team with most of the team playing up at least one group.

The again club hosted a very successful Junior Blast Program, with over 20 kids attending being trained and encouraged by Jordan Hayes, Woodsy and co. We hope to see all those kids back next year for our Junior Blasters or to join a Master Blasters Team.

A number of our junior players successfully tried out for the HKDCA Junior Representative Squads. For a relatively small club having 13 players make representatives squads is a fine achievement.

The individual team reports make for some great reading and its pleasing to see so much enjoyment out on the cricket field.

There were a lot of good team performances and a lot of good individual performances. I would also like to offer my congratulations to the junior cricketers who received a special club award.

And most importantly, a big thank you to all the families. To the coaches, managers, umpires, scorers, supporters, and hangers on, for all your time and expertise generously provided across the season.

Without you, our junior cricket program simply wouldn't exist!

SENIOR CRICKET CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

The 2020-2021 season started later than normal due to Covid 19, and the pre-season T20 comp was not run this season.

The regular season saw the club field 3 teams, A2 Kookaburra Cup, B1 and C3 Grades. The club saw some new faces and a couple of returned players, during the season 10 Junior players played most weeks for Seniors throughout the 3 grades. A greater number of registrations particularly part time regos allowed the club to be in the position of having to leave players out most weeks, which was a better option to be in than running short.

The club enjoyed mostly good results and the atmosphere around the club with all 3 teams enjoying their cricket and the club BBQs on the balcony after matches.

A2 Kookaburra Cup team had a great season. We welcomed new players such as Daniel Habib and returning players Sahil Sharma. Captained by Tejas Padsala the team played through the 11 rounds of the season - we won 5 matches, 2 losses and 4 draws - finishing the regular season 2nd on the table. The semi-final against Hornsby was rain-affected and no result possible so the team progressed to the Grand Final where they meet a very strong Berowra team and went down in a tough match.

B1 Grade team had a tough season with the team being moved up to B grade at the start of season and then, with many key players suffering long term injuries, inconsistent results plagued the team. During the season the team was captained by Owen Rajayogan, initially followed by Rob Jones and A. Sheorayan (Ditzy) debuting in the captaincy role. The team finished the year with 1 win, 1 draw and 8 losses. The team is looking forward to the 2021-2022 season to regain the form of previous seasons.

C3 Grade team had a great season with a team filled with a bunch of old blokes and juniors from U15/16 that elected to play seniors instead of juniors. 11 rounds of the season saw the team finish with 1 outright victory, 4 first innings wins, 2 draws and 4 1st innings losses to finish 3rd on the table. The semi-final saw the team take on Mount Colah and with Normo in a good position going into 2nd week the weather turned and no play was possible and unfortunately ending the season.

The club enjoyed an influx of new players, returning players and increase in juniors playing during the season. If the numbers continue the club will look to play 4 teams in 2021-2022. Some notable performances during the season with hundreds to Michael Devitt x 2, Wayne Slawski, a maiden century to Karthik Ramesh and another to Craig Woods. During the season the club saw some tremendous bowling efforts with Lochie Bailey having an 11 wicket match in round 11. The season ended with 5 wickets hauls to Henry Gross, Andrew Watson (now a pace bowler), Martin Day and Lochie Bailey x 4.

The end of season Senior Presentation Day was held at Pennant Hills Bowling Club with a game of lawn bowls followed by the presentations.
